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Homework

In line with Key Stage 2, Year 4 are set weekly homework which will include: Reading

Pupils are expected to read to an adult at home for at least fifteen minutes, four times weekly. Please ensure this is documented in planners. We check and sign planners once a week, giving Dojo points for regular reading. All 'Big Cat' reading books should be read aloud to an adult.

Maths

Tasks will be set on the MyMaths website. The tasks will be set on a Monday and is due on a Friday. Times tables should be practised at least 4 times every week and noted in the planners. Children earn Dojo points for regular times table practise. English

There will be an English activity set each week. This may be grammar, reading comprehension or a written task. English homework is **set on a Thursday** and is **due in the following Monday**.

Spelling quizzes

Children will have weekly spelling quizzes every **Tuesday** to check understanding of spelling rules taught in school. Children can practise these through the **EdShed** website, using games to learn the new words. Lists have been sent home for the first half term, and will be uploaded on the VLE weekly. P.E.

Year 4 have PE on Tuesdays and swimming on Wednesdays.
