The children will participate in the process of writing by discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write, as well as proofreading their work for punctuation and spellings. They will start a new line for dialogue for a new speaker.

Our children will be able to ensure the correct subject and verb when using singular or plural. They will use a variety of cohesive devices in sentences and paragraphs. The children will participate in the process of writing by identifying the auditience and purpose of their writing, as well as proposing changes to their vocabulary, grammar and punctuation to enhance effects. They will use commas to clarify meaning.
