Why is cursive Handwriting important?

- By making each letter in one movement, children's hands develop a 'physical memory' of it, making it easier to produce the correct shape.
- All letters flow from left to right making it less likely for children to reverse letters.
- There is a clear distinction between upper and lower case letters.
- The continuous flow of writing improves speed of writing and aids accurate spelling.

Things to remember

We have three main rules of handwriting: · all lower-case letters start on the line; · all lower-case letters (not capitals) are joined; · all capitals and numbers start high up (9, B, D, 4) and don't join lower-case letters.
