
English



Reading

We believe in the importance of teaching reading skills to children. We will be reading a variety of text genres that link to our learning across the curriculum

Our class texts this term are Hide and Seek: A Bletchley Park Mystery by Rhian Tracey and Home Again: Stories about coming home from war by The Royal British Legion, both of which support our historical study of Britain at War.



Writing

This term, we will explore a range of text types and their features, before writing our own.

These will include:

- Narrative writing
- Newspaper report
- Letter writing
- Diary writing

Spelling

We learn to understand, use and apply spelling rules through investigations and practice.

Mathematics


Area, perimeter and volume: Classification of shapes and how to find the area, perimeter and/or volume of 2D and 3D shapes

Homework

As preparation for secondary school, Year 6 set weekly homework which will include:

Reading

Pupils are expected to read to an adult at home for at least fifteen minutes, three times weekly. Please ensure this is documented in planners. In Year 6, we check and sign planners on a Monday. All 'Big Cat' reading books should be read aloud to an adult.

Maths

Tasks will be set on the MyMaths website. The tasks will be set on a Thursday and will be checked on a Tuesday.

Times Table Rockstars (or equivalent) should be used for a **minimum** of 15 minutes per week..

English

There will be a grammar activity and a spelling activity set each week. Spelling words should be written out 3 times and then correctly applied to a sentence. Please refer to the VLE for lists. Spelling quizzes are each Friday. English homework is set on a Monday for submission on Friday.

Topic

There will be project based homework set each half term. These will be available to view on the VLE (hard copies can be provided on request), with clear hand in dates.

Year 6 have PE on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

Pupils are expected to wear full PE kit including:
