Important days during the week



Please ensure that you send your child's reading folder into school everyday.

Library - Tuesday.

The children will go to the school Library each week on a Tuesday. While there they will be able to select a book to take home and read with their grown ups. These books should be returned to school the following week so that they can be returned and a new book selected.

PE - Monday and Friday

Although PE is on a **Monday** and **Friday** the children will take part in a variety of physical activities during the week so it is important that they are wearing appropriate footwear.

An overview of what the children will be learning about will be placed onto the VLE on a **Monday** each week. Please check the VLE each week as we place home learning challenges and weekly advance organisers on there.

Reading folders will be collected each week on a **Wednesday** with new books sent home on a **Friday**.

We welcome the children to bring in items from home to share with the class as show and tell but these need to be named and given to a member of Butterfly class staff in the morning so that they can be placed in a safe place. We ask that the items that are brought in for show and tell are linked to what the children are learning about. Please note that while we will do our best to ensure that these are safe accidents do happen and toys do get broken.

Literacy



Reading

- Each week the children will take books home.
- Monster phonics books are designed for the children to read to an adult, they
 will have read these books in school as part of their guided reading. Monster
 phonics books link to the sounds that the children have learnt within their
 phonics lessons and they have learnt the skills to decode and blend the words
 independently.
- Big Cat books are sharing books and are aimed for an adult to read with the children. The children will be able to read them almost independently but will need support with unfamiliar sounds and words from an adult.
- Children will start to bring home Monster Phonics books with words, these books will have been read 3 times in school with an adult, they should be able to decode and blend the words independently. When your child is reading these books please

encourage them to re-read what they have decoded as this will help them to develop fluency and word recognition.

- The children may also have a second book each week. This will be a Big Cat book and may have words in, please read this book with your child.
 - Please write in your child's diary when they have read the 'Big Cat' or 'Monster phonics' book with an adult at home.
 - It is important that you also share and discuss picture books, signs, labels, rhymes and songs with your child.
 - *Regular reading at home will enable your child to make more progress.*

Phonics

- At Cheddington school we follow the Monster Phonics Systematic, Synthetic Phonics programme.
- Children have learnt all the single letter sounds and are now working on digraphs, two letters that make one sound. The children have been amazing at doing the actions when saying the sound.
 - Skills focus on blending and segmenting of decodable CVC (constant, vowel, consonant) words alongside reading the first 60 Reception High Frequency Words.
- The children are also developing their skills in forming these letters and will begin to write simple words using their phonics knowledge.

Writing	
• The children will be developing their FMC (Fine Motor Control) everyday so that they	
develop their hand strength and other skills needed before they can write	
comfortably.	

- We ensure that writing is fun for the children and encourage a variety of mark making activities throughout the day.
- The children will take part in 'dough disco' and 'wriggle while you swiggle' to encourage mark making and FMC.
- All children will be supported in developing their writing skills, by writing different things e.g. lists, labels, cards...

Literacy based on books

- The children take part in literacy lessons everyday and these lessons are based on a book. From this the children will;
 - Make predictions
 - Create story maps
 - Use speech bubbles
 - Understand questions
 - Write simple sentences
 - Learn about sentence structures
 - Follow recipes
 - Act out stories

Maths



The children will be following the White Rose Maths Scheme through a mixture of adult-led activities as well as independent learning. The topics that we will be covering this term are :

- Subitising, finding and representing numbers 0-5
 - Mass and capacity
 - Exploring numbers 6, 7 and 8
 - Length, height and time
 - Exploring numbers 9 and 10
 - Exploring 3-D shapes

To help your child at home we suggest that you play board games, do lots of counting of objects, look for numbers in the environment and do cooking together. These skills will develop your child's understanding and embed their knowledge and understanding.

EYFS curriculum areas



The areas of learning are; communication and language; personal, social and emotional development; physical development; literacy; mathematics; understanding the world and expressive arts and design. Through the below topics the children will have exposure to all areas of the EYFS curriculum.

The children will be looking at the topic 'Animal Safari'. This topic looks at animals that live in different areas of the world, thinking about what the animals might eat and their habitat. This topic teaches the children about how to look after animals and the importance of caring for our local and global environments.

We will move onto the topic 'Big Wide World'. This project teaches the children about the global community to which they belong and explores how living things, communities and climate differ around the world. The children will use their knowledge from 'Animal Safari' to support their learning in this topic.

As we progress through the spring term we will be looking at the topic 'Starry Night'. This topic explores the difference in the world at night compared to the day. It teaches children about the importance of a good night's sleep, and helps them to discover what is happening in the world while they are sleeping, including finding out about nocturnal animals. The last topic we will be looking at in the spring term is 'Signs of Spring'. This project teaches the children about the changes that happen during the spring, including weather and the festivals that are celebrated at this time of year.

RE & PSHE



In PSHE the children will learn dreams and goals; within this topic the children will learn about challenges, not giving up, setting and achieving goals and supporting each other.

The children will also be learning about being healthy; within this topic the children will learn about our body, moving our body, food including healthy and unhealthy and keeping clean.

In RE, for the first half term, the children will be looking at the topic "How do people celebrate?" They will be exploring how New Year is celebrated in different countries and learning about the festival of Holi. In the second half of the term, the children will be looking at the topic "What is Easter?" and will be exploring how the Christian festival is celebrated.



PE is on a **Monday** and **Friday**. The children will be developing their use of space and using resources in different ways.

- The children will also be able to use equipment in the outside area.
- *PE kit should be in school all week (it will be sent home each half term).*
 - Long hair needs to be tied up
 - All earrings need to be removed or covered with tape.
- Please ensure that the children have appropriate clothing for the weather.
- All PE kit needs to be clearly labelled and please encourage the children to develop independence by practise getting changed by themselves.

Homework



Reading

Children should be reading their Monster Phonics books at home as often as possible. Reading for 5 minutes everyday is often better than reading once for longer.

It is also important to share stories from picture books everyday.

Home Learning Challenges

On a **Monday** a selection of activities will be uploaded to the VLE. These activities are for you to do at home if you wish to. These will be linked to the learning in class.

We will look at these if they are brought into school.

Weekly Advanced Organiser

Please use this to support you in talking to your child about what they might have been learning at school. This will enable them to show you what they know and to extend and embed their learning. These organisers will be placed onto the VLE every Monday.
