
English

Anglo-Saxons – Discovering this period of British History using archaeological evidence and legends (Sutton Hoo, Beowolf) to explore the settlement, organisation and impact of Anglo-Saxon society.

Music

Rock anthems - 'Livin' on a Prayer'. Jazz and improvisation, and Swing.

P.E.

Football, dance, multi skills

R.E.

Sacred Texts – Exploration of the sacred texts that are central to the religions and practices of Islam and Christianity.

Mathematics

Place Value - Roman Numerals to 1,000, numbers to 1,000 000 (comparing, ordering, partitioning, rounding,) Powers of 10



Addition and Subtraction— mental strategies, add and subtract numbers with more than 4 digits, multi-step problems, using inverse

Multiplication and Division- multiples, factors, prime, square, cube numbers, multiply and divide by 10, 100, 1000

Fractions - unit, non-unit, equivalent fractions, converting improper fractions to mixed numbers, addition and subtraction of fractions, compare and order fractions

Science

Earth and Space – a look at the scale and features of the planets and their relative distance to the sun,. 9th November - visit to the National Space Centre in Leicester



'Forces in action' - practical investigations to look at gravity, friction, air resistance and water resistance with a focus on planning and carrying out a fair test, recording data and presenting findings from enquiries

Set weekly, homework will include:

Reading

Pupils are expected to read to an adult at home for at least fifteen minutes, three times weekly. **Please ensure this is documented in planners.** In Year 5, we check and sign planners on a Friday. All 'Big Cat' reading books should be read aloud to an adult. There are also "reading for comprehension" activities at the end of the book.

Maths

Tasks will be available on the VLE website. They will be set on a Friday and need to be handed in by the following Wednesday. Times tables should be practised at home at least 3 times a week and documented accordingly in planners.

English

There will either be a grammar activity or a writing activity from the Year 5 matrix set each week. Spelling words should be written out 3 times and then correctly applied to a sentence in the pupil's English homework book. Please refer to the VLE for lists. Spelling Quizes are on Friday. Regular practise of spellings should be documented in planners. English homework is set on a Friday for submission on Wednesday.

Topic

In the Autumn Term the children will be given a selection of topic themed activities to choose from. Details will be posted on the VLE.



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
Recommended Reading



P.E

Year 5 have PE on Wednesday and Thursday. However, for the first half of the term we will be swapping PE from a Wednesday to a Tuesday as we will be working with a cricket coach.

Pupils are expected to wear full PE kit including:

- T-shirt in the colour of their house
- Red or black shorts (No Bermuda style or lycra shorts please)
- Plain dark jogging bottoms and a sweatshirt may be worn over PE kit in colder weather
- Plimsolls for indoor games
- Trainers for outdoor games
