Reading

We believe in the importance of teaching reading skills to children. We will be reading a variety of text genres and building our knowledge of new vocabulary as well as developing our retrieval skills. Our class texts this term are:

This Morning I Met a Whale by Michael Morpurgo

Varjak Paw SF Said by Dave McKean

The sandwich by Tony Bradman

Writing

This term we will explore and develop our understanding of these texts, using them to inspire a range of writing opportunities. These will include:

narrative writing
explanations
persuasive writing
poetry recitation
Spelling

We learn to understand, use and apply spelling rules through investigations and practice. Our spelling lists for this term can be found on our class VLE page.

Maths



We will be exploring the following topics in maths this term:

Multiplication and division: 3/6/9 tables; 7/11/12 tables; multiplying by 1 and 0; multiplying 3 numbers; factors and formal methods of multiplication

Length & Perimeter: measuring in kilometres and meters; finding perimeter of rectilinear shapes and polygons

Fractions: mixed numbers; equivalent fractions; adding fractions

Decimals: using tenths and hundredths

Science



We are learning about Grouping and Classifying which is grouping living things, known as classification. They study the animal and plant kingdoms and use and create classification keys to identify living things.

We will also learn about States of matter, solids, liquids and gases and their characteristic properties. They observe how materials change state as they are heated and cooled, and learn key terminology associated with these processes.

Foundation Subjects



Geography:

We are learning about the characteristics and features of rivers and mountain ranges around the world, including a detailed exploration of the ecosystems and processes that shape them and the land around them.

Music:

Our topic 'Stop!' focuses on one song: Stop! - a rap/song about bullying. You will learn about the interrelated dimensions of music through games, singing and composing. While our 'Lean on Me' topic is focused on musical learning; the integration of musical learning/practice is key when delivering your music lesson. Music must be taught musically; pupils and teachers need to be active musicians.

Computing:

We are exploring Programming - Repetition in Shapes and Data Logging in our Data and information unit.

RE & PSHE



We will be exploring these topics this term:

PSHE:

We are learning about 'Dreams & Goals' where we will focus on aspirations, how to achieve goals and understanding the emotions that go with this. While our 'Healthy Me' topic is all about being and keeping safe and healthy.

RE:

We are learning about one religion this term: Christianity. We will be exploring the big idea: Do people need to go to church to show they are Christians? In Spring 2 we will exploring the big idea: Is forgiveness always possible for Christians?

Homework



In Tiger Class, we expect children to be completing the following, weekly:

- reading (at least 4 times a week, signed into their planner)
 - spellings
 - TT Rockstars times tables practice

We will also have one 'Theme Project' each half term so that the children can showcase their new knowledge. These will be linked to what we are learning in class. You can find all the information about our Theme Project on our class VLE.
